



SHACKLEFORD SHACKLEFORD HOUSE BREWHOUSE SU 934 455

A Bargate stone building with brick quoins and dressings is set beside the drive up to the House. The Venetian window faces the gate and can be seen on the way up to the house. The wall separates the grounds and drive from the yards between brewhouse and servants quarters and kitchens. The door in faces the kitchen and the brewing chimney is on the said away from the drive. Facing the house is a little upper feature and a wide string course both at eaves level and at first floor level.

Inside there is one room on each floor with the stair up just inside the door.

Both floors are now used for tutirials so no original features remain.

The Bargate stone has ironstone galleting.
