



SHACKLEFORD SHACKLEFORD HOUSE STABLE BLOCK SU 934 454

The stable block has been converted into dwellings and was not seen inside. It is a fine building of Bargate stone of nearly brick size. with galleting and brick dressings, and brick plinth. Other doors and windows have been cut. The central arch has a keystone also of rubbed brick. Eaves have rubbed brick mouldings. The clock tower and bell has different dates on each face. It is a coachhouse befitting the residence of the early eighteenth century. It is parallel with the drive up to the house, and the arched entrance led to a courtyard beyond. The pediment faced the drive.

The upper floor had been a hay loft for the horses in the stables below.
